Enrollment Process:

1. **Complete on-line application**, be sure to digitally sign, submit and confirm your signature with the link you receive via email.

Payment Due at the Time of Registration

- \$50.00 non-refundable enrollment fee
- First month tuition: The first payable month is September. August tuition is forgiven upfront for days not in session during the school year. See the enrollment application for your monthly rate.

3. **Download and Print your medical forms and have your physician complete them.** They may be returned by FAX, the number is 417-887-2131, ATT: Michele. The number is also located at the bottom of the forms. If you have a child that will be immunization exempt, please obtain an exemption form at the Health Department and submit within 10 days of registration.

General Information:

All students will be graded on **their age on August 1** of the current school year. No exceptions to this guideline will be considered.

• Children enrolled for three or four year old classes must be completely potty trained in order to participate.

Session hours are 9:00 am to 1:00 pm.



 is approved. Registration for summer classes will begin mid-April. View your school calendar for

Tuition:

Tuition is to be paid on a monthly basis on the first day of each month. A payment envelope will be provided for you to return your payment in each month. Payment may be made by check or on-line via Secure Pay on the website. You are able to make this a one time payment or set up automatic payments to be paid on the first day of each month. If you pay on Secure Pay, please return your payment envelope and note you made an online payment each month. These envelopes are kept on file to verify your payment.

Drop Off and Pick Up:

For children <u>under age two</u>, you will enter the building at the main entrance and use the secure check-in procedure located in the Tiny Town area. Carline will be located on the east side of the building under the portico for <u>two, three and four year olds</u>. The line will commence at <u>8:45 am for dropoff and 12:45 pm for pick up</u>. Please, hang the center provided cartag from your review mirror with the name facing outward for teachers to identify the child you will be picking up. If you would encounter an emergency that would involve picking your child up late, please note the number located on the back of your cartag (417-887-7153) to notify the center of your emergency situation.



Late Fees:

You will be responsible for a late fee paid directly to your child's teacher that will be charged at the rate of **\$5.00 for every 15 minutes** you are late beginning at 1:01 pm.

Lunch:

Send a sack lunch for your child each day. Please, make sure you send items that do not need to be reheated or refrigerated as the Health Department regulations state, we are **NOT** allowed to do any food preparations due to facility license. If you send cold foods be sure to include a cold pack as you would for elementary school.

Birthdays at School:

Your child may celebrate their birthday at school by bringing a special snack to be shared with their classmates at lunch. We ask that it be something small and easy for teachers to distribute. **No ice cream or large cupcakes**. Invitations for parties held away from the facility may be distributed if they include all students in the classroom.

Classroom Parties:

We will allow parents to help conduct classroom parties on a rotating basis. Look for a sign up sheet in the classroom. To make this a special time for your prechool student please make other childcare arrangements for siblings.
